Board Committee Job Descriptions

- **Aging Committee** - The mission of the committee is to work in three core areas: Educational and career opportunities; Long-term care facilities and providers; and Aging policies. The committee reports to the Board of Directors on a quarterly basis, or as requested by the Board.
- **Chapter Committee on Nominations and Leadership Identification** – The mission of the committee is an open and fair nomination and election process that consistently provides a high level of quality and diversity among the elective leadership.
- **Finance Committee** – will be headed by the chapter Treasurer; the committee will meet at least annually to review chapter fiscal policies and to approve the chapter budget.
- **Government Affairs** – The mission of the committee is to develop and mobilize the political potential of the Chapter’s membership in order to impact government policy decisions by the direct involvement of social workers in the political process, specifically in legislative action. The committee will also seek to impact SW students and their understanding of the political process by sponsoring educational events that bring together students, social workers, and elected officials.
- **Membership and Public Relations Committee** - will examine, establish and publicize opportunities for members to contact elected leadership; membership needs and expectations will be assessed; enhance student involvement in NASW committees; identify the undergraduate and graduates schools of Social Work and identify which schools have current recruitment activities; establish a contact person at each school for coordination purposes; and make efforts to be present at orientation and ongoing functions to promote the professional organization.
- **PACE** – The mission of the committee is to renew and strengthen social workers’ organized and professional involvement in the political process of South Carolina; and to review and select candidates to receive NASW SC endorsements and financial support.
- **Personnel Committee** – The mission of the committee is to oversee, evaluate, and make recommendations for the staffing of the Chapter.
- **Professional Review Committee** (Ethics Committee) – The mission of the Committee on Ethics, is as defined in the NASW Procedures for Professional Review and the Professional Review Technical Aids. The Committee on Ethics shall be responsible for hearing and determining complaints filed in accord with the Association’s policy on professional review.
- **School of Social Work** – Currently no participants.
- **Strategic Planning Committee** – The mission of the committee is to develop a unified course of action for the Chapter through mindful, purposeful, and ongoing planning. This planning will include the development of primary goals and objectives, and indicate the responsible committees or entities.
- **Symposium Committee** – The mission of the committee is to organize an extensive program to commemorate March as Social Work Month, and to bring together social workers from across the state to network, to further their education, to meet with elected officials, and to be recognized for their hard work and efforts throughout the year.
